Dear Friends:

A steward is someone in charge of managing someone else's property, not someone who makes stews, or someone's ward. We Christians believe that every good thing is a gift that ultimately comes from God.

Physicians and nurses, beneficiaries of years of decades of medical training from their predecessors, drag us into the first light of day in rooms built by architects, financiers, brick layers, plumbers, electricians, carpenters, and painters; filled with equipment manufactured elsewhere; accessed by roads built by governments and road crews; in cars assembled thousands of miles away from metal, chemicals, parts, and plans. We are cleaned and clothed with fabrics grown and manufactured by workers thousands of miles away whom we will never know.

The doctor speaks words in a language that combines a hundred national dialects, gradually standardized by millions of people's usage over centuries. An aide writes down data using a numerical system invented by Arabs thousands of years ago. And, all we've done so far is scream.

We are dependent on nature that sustains us, the people who have gone before us, and those who in sharing our moment in history, make life possible for us today.

Language, the arts, music, markets, businesses, religious institutions, politics, and culture are all there the day before we are born. We don't invent them, though we have the opportunity to enjoy, enlarge and reshape them. Ultimately, no one pulls themselves up by their bootstrap without a huge boost from other people.

We owe more to the anonymous inventor of the wheel, the person who figured out how to make fire on demand, and the people who crafted intelligible writing and numbers than we owe to our landlord or mortgage company. But, we cannot pay them back, so our task is to share laterally with others in our era, and forward toward those yet to come.

Our contributions of time, talent, treasure to and through the church are an important part, and symbol, of our larger calling to discipleship, to be good stewards of God's good earth and all God's children.

The Council has designated the special Advent/Christmas offerings to be split between the Upper Montgomery Assistance Network (UMAN) and our own Parish Care Fund. UMAN works with organizations such as Gaithersburg HELP to provide emergency financial assistance, education, and referral services to people in our community who are at risk. Our Parish Care Fund is used, at the discretion of the Parish Care Coordinator and Pastor, and in conjunction with the Membership Assistance Fund, to provide emergency support to members in need within our own congregation

**Oct. 30, Nov. 6 and Nov. 13**, the Middle East Working Group of the Metro DC Synod of the ELCA will lead a discussion of "Kairos Palestine: a moment of truth," a document that the recent synod convention and ELCA's national assembly urged congregations to study. **Oct. 30** - Jean Martensen, "Introduction to the "Kairos Palestine" Statement and the Conditions that Shaped It." Martensen is former Director of Peace Education of the ELCA and former staff in the Commission for Women on Domestic Violence.

**Nov. 6** - Paul Verdun, "A Moment of Truth: What Does the Lord Require of Us in the Middle East?" Verdun is Co-Coordinator of Sabeel DC Metro, the Washington DC affiliate of Friends of Sabeel, North America and Ecumenical Liaison for the ELCA grassroots Middle East network, Peace Not Walls. He recently spent three weeks in the Holy Land.

**Nov. 13** - Nathan Rich, "A Word of Faith, Hope, and Love: a Closer Look at the Kairos Palestine Document." Rich is Chairperson of the Middle East Working Group of the Metro DC Synod of the ELCA and Co-Chair of the Washington Interfaith Alliance for Middle East Peace.

**Nov. 20** -The Rev. Phil Anderson, "The Lutheran World Federation (LWF) in Central America." Anderson has been the LWF Representative to Central America and was Pastor and Director of the Comite de Desarrollo de la Comunidad, Iglesia Evangelica Luterana de Colombia.

**Nov. 27** - Pastor Hoehn, "The United Nations Millennium Development Goals."

How can you give more hope? Participate in the **Gifts of Hope** program at CTS. During Advent, you can purchase a Gift of Hope for a friend or

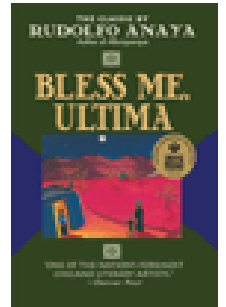
